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What is Brain Walk?

Brain Walk is an interactive walk through the brain via a 10-station interactive learning experience.

Some stations focus on the various lobes of the brain; as well, there are stations for prevention, brain injury outcomes and a video on real life experiences.

The interactive learning includes hands-on games, visual activities, tasting, and physical activity.

The purpose of Brain Walk is to inspire the students to realize how important the brain is and what it can do, thereby developing a natural desire to protect the brain.
